

ave you ever wondered what you can do to help Calaveras Big Trees State Park continue to be such a fabulous park, one that people visit year after year? Have you ever felt you'd like to help the park remain the exceptional camping and hiking destination it is? Well, here's your chance!

California State Parks manages more than 270 park units throughout California. These parks encompass nearly 1.3 million acres of land, 18,000 campsites, and 3,000 miles of trails. The recreational activities and unique outdoor experiences these parklands offer draw approximately 85 million visitors to California's state parks each year—200,000 to Calaveras Big Trees State Park alone.

With such high use, trails and campsites can quickly deteriorate if they don't receive proper care. That's where you come in.

Concerned individuals, families, organizations and businesses can help us meet the challenge of maintaining trails and campsites.

Camping and hiking in our state parks is a fun and inexpensive way to get your family or organization to spend quality time in the outdoors. These activities contribute to the physical and mental health of park visitors and often become treasured traditions that people look forward to year after year. But the opportunity to take part in camping and hiking activities isn't something to be taken for granted. There are costs associated with keeping our camping and hiking facilities clean and safe.

The maintenance of campsites includes repairing and installing tables, fire rings, food lockers, restrooms and water faucets, as well as caring for parking pads and



installing parking barriers. Other responsibilities include rehabilitation of native vegetation, pruning and raking around the campsites, and installing and maintaining signs. Trail maintenance entails annual brushing and clearing, bringing trails up to state park standards, and installing and repairing bridges, turnpikes, rock walls and



drainage features. To make trails as useful to visitors as possible, we provide directional and interpretive signs and displays, develop trail guides and maps, reroute trails when necessary, and protect natural and cultural resources along trail routes. In addition, California State Parks has an ongoing commitment to make campgrounds and trails accessible to visitors with disabilities.

If you would like to help support these important activities, there is something you can do. Your donation to either the Adopta-Campsite or Adopt-a-Trail program will fund these important tasks and equipment. These programs are a joint venture between California State Parks and the Calaveras Big Trees Association.

With your donation of \$1,000—roughly the cost of maintaining a campsite for one year—you will be helping California State Parks provide quality camping experiences at Calaveras Big Trees State Park—one campsite at a time. In return for your dona-

If you love hiking state park trails, you can now help keep them clean and wellmaintained with your donation of \$500 the cost of maintaining one mile of hiking trail for one year. Contributions to this program will be used for trail maintenance in Calaveras Big Trees State Park and to purchase much needed trail supplies for the park. For your donation you will receive a handsome certificate of appreciation (suitable for framing) and a complimentary oneyear membership in the Calaveras Big Trees Association. In addition, your name will be placed on a donor recognition sign within the park for one year.*

Participation in these programs does not involve actual maintenance work on your part. However, whether you choose to donate or not, you are always welcome to volunteer your time at the park, assisting with a variety of activities. There's always something to be done, and you're likely to have fun and meet great people in the process.
