



Tumalo State Park

Nearby Things To Do

A 2.4-mile segment of the 12-mile **Deschutes River Trail** is accessible from Tumalo State Park. Walk through the day-use area to hike approximately 1.4 miles upriver along the beautiful canyon bordering the Deschutes River. (Bikes are not allowed on the upriver section, and dogs are not allowed at Bend Park and Recreation's Riley Ranch.) Cross the OB Riley Road bridge from the campground and hike another one-mile stretch downriver along the Deschutes. Future improvements will connect the trail to Bend.

Pilot Butte State Scenic Viewpoint on the east side of Bend offers a spectacular view of central Oregon. You can drive to the summit in the summer, or hike up one of its trails all year.

Tumalo Falls, open seasonally, is approximately 15 miles southwest of the park. Information: U.S. Forest Service at 541-383-5300.

Newberry National Volcanic Monument, south of Bend, is a volcanic wonderland that includes five-mile-wide Newberry Crater with two popular fishing lakes, 110 miles of trails, Lava Lands Visitor Center, Lava Cast Forest, and Lava River Cave, an underground mile-long lava tube that visitors can access seasonally via a rough, steep trail. The High Desert Museum just south of Bend is an indoor/outdoor museum with trails and interpretive exhibits.

- Smith Rock State Park: Tent camping only; no camping in vehicles or RV's. Camping area is 200+ feet walking distance from parking area. 541-548-7501.
- Skull Hollow Campground: Operated by U.S. Forest Service. No RV hookups or drinking water. Sites are first-come, first-served.

Madras (1 hour drive)

- Cove Palisades State Park: Closed during winter. 541-546-3412.

Other

- Cascade Lakes Area/Century Drive/Mt. Bachelor: Multiple U.S. Forest Service Campgrounds located in the high lakes area.
- Dispersed camping (camping not in a campground) is allowed on land managed by U.S. Forest Service and Bureau of Land Management. Dispersed camping is not allowed in any Oregon State Parks.

Discovery Park: North West Crossing, fenced with walking path. 1315 NW Discovery Park Drive.

Awbrey Reservoir: 5 acres unfenced, on-street parking. NW 10th & Trenton.

Overturf Butte Reservoir: 4 acres fenced. 475 NW 17th St.

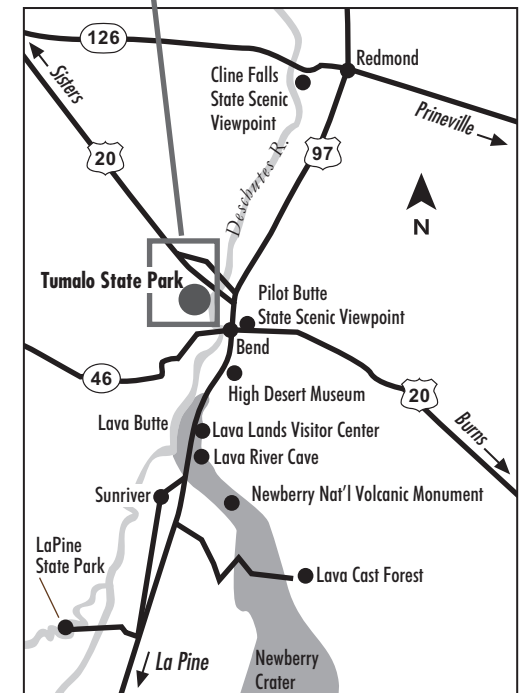
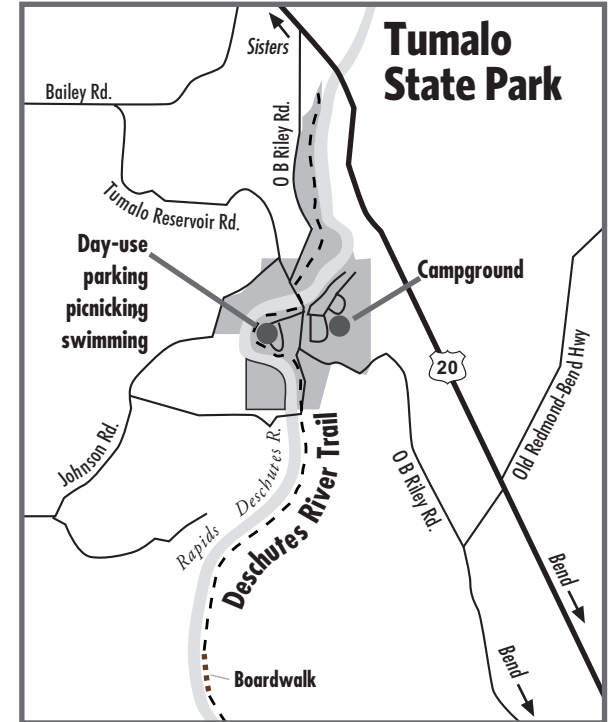
Riverbend Park: 1 acre fenced, small dog area and river access. 799 Columbia St., across the river from the Old Mill.

Hollinshead Park: 3 grass acres, partially fenced. 1235 NE Jones Rd.

Ponderosa Park: 3 acres fenced, some grass. 224 SE 15th St.

Pine Nursery Park: 16 acres fenced, with trails, grass and small dog area. 3750 NE Purcell.

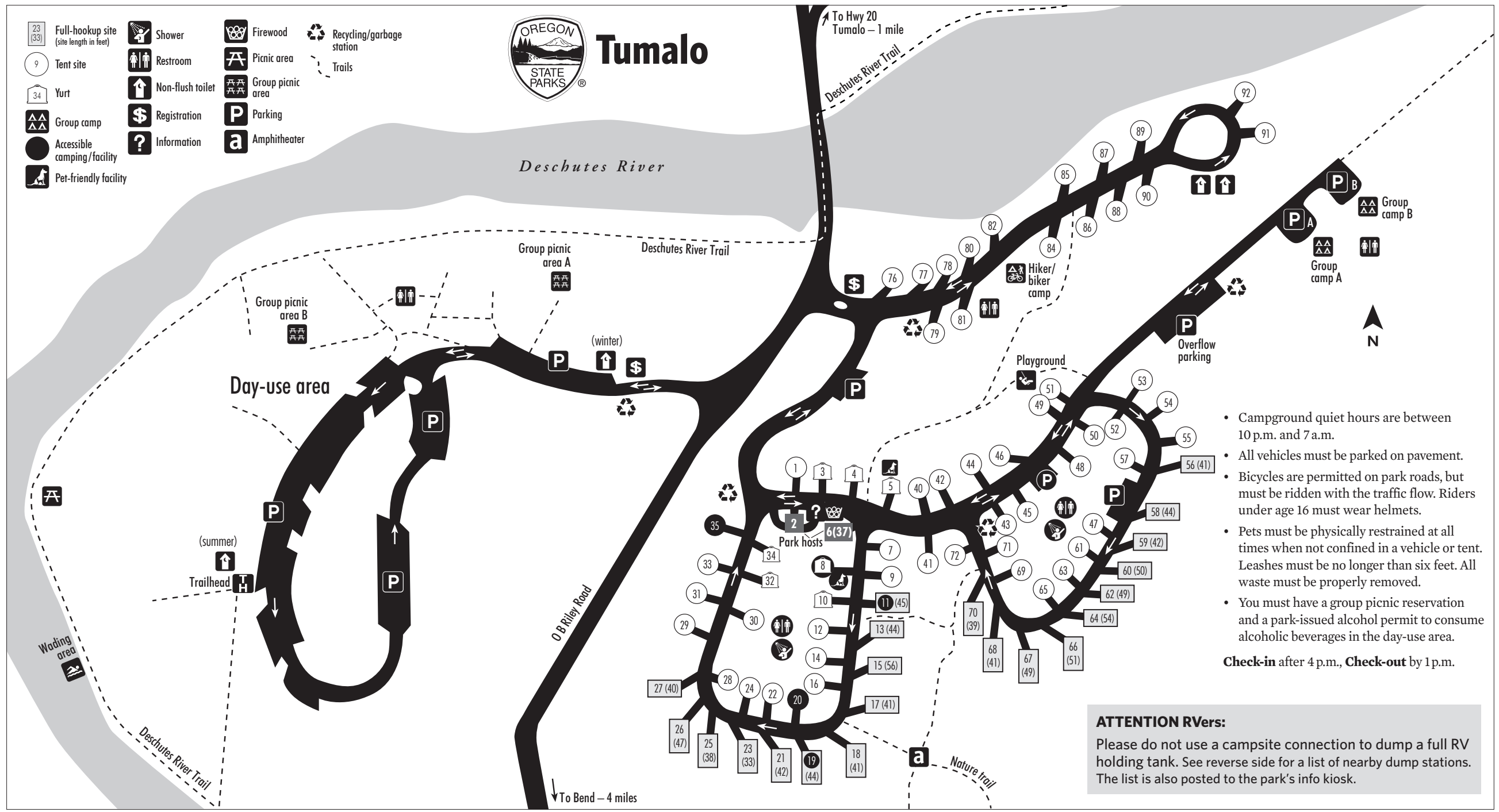
Big Sky Park: 11 acres, partially fenced with grass sections. 21690 Neff Rd.

- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
 - All vehicles must be parked on pavement.
 - Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but must be ridden with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
 - Pets must be physically restrained at all times when not confined in a vehicle or tent. Leashes must be no longer than six feet. All waste must be properly removed.
 - You must have a group picnic reservation and a park-issued alcohol permit to consume alcoholic beverages in the day-use area.
- Check-in** after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.
