### FTNTP has much to offer:

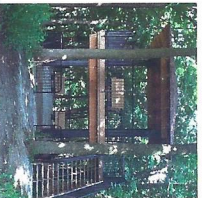
- Pavilion, restrooms and playground

### Park Regulations

These regulations are part of the complete Flushing Township Nature Park Ordinance #68-98, which can be found in the main kiosk.

All are punishable as a civil infraction.

- Dogs must be on a leash and under control of their owner at all times. Horses are permitted on designated trails (see map legend) and under control of their owner at all times.
- Clean up after your pet!
- Motor vehicles must remain on designated roads, trails and parking lots and follow posted speed limit: (5 mph to river access)
- Bicycles are permitted, use safely.
- Pedestrians and wildlife have right-of-way!
- Unlawful to destroy or deface park property.
- Unlawful to willfully destroy or remove plant or animal life.
- No hunting or trapping.
- Alcohol and illegal drugs are prohibited.
- No littering, please use the "leave no trace" ethic.
- No swimming.
- Camping must be approved by the Township.
- No fires unless approved by the Township.
- No trespassing past park operating hours, sunrise to sunset.
- No overnight parking.

### River Access Regulations

- These regulations are part of the FTNTP Ordinance #68-98 S 13.1-33.
- Speed limit 5 mph
- Vehicles must remain on river access trail, follow and comply with posted signs
- Wildlife and pedestrians have right of way!
- Park only in designated area
- Launch and recovery in designated area is limited to non-motorized watercraft less than 20 feet
- Watercraft is to be carried to/from the parking area to the launch site: no backing vehicle or trailer to launch or river's edge
- No overnight parking at launch site
- River vehicle access may be closed due to trail conditions and special events

### Pavilion Information

The pavilion is available for small groups. It may be reserved for guaranteed use with a nonrefundable fee of \$50. Reservations must be made at least 72 hours in advance. 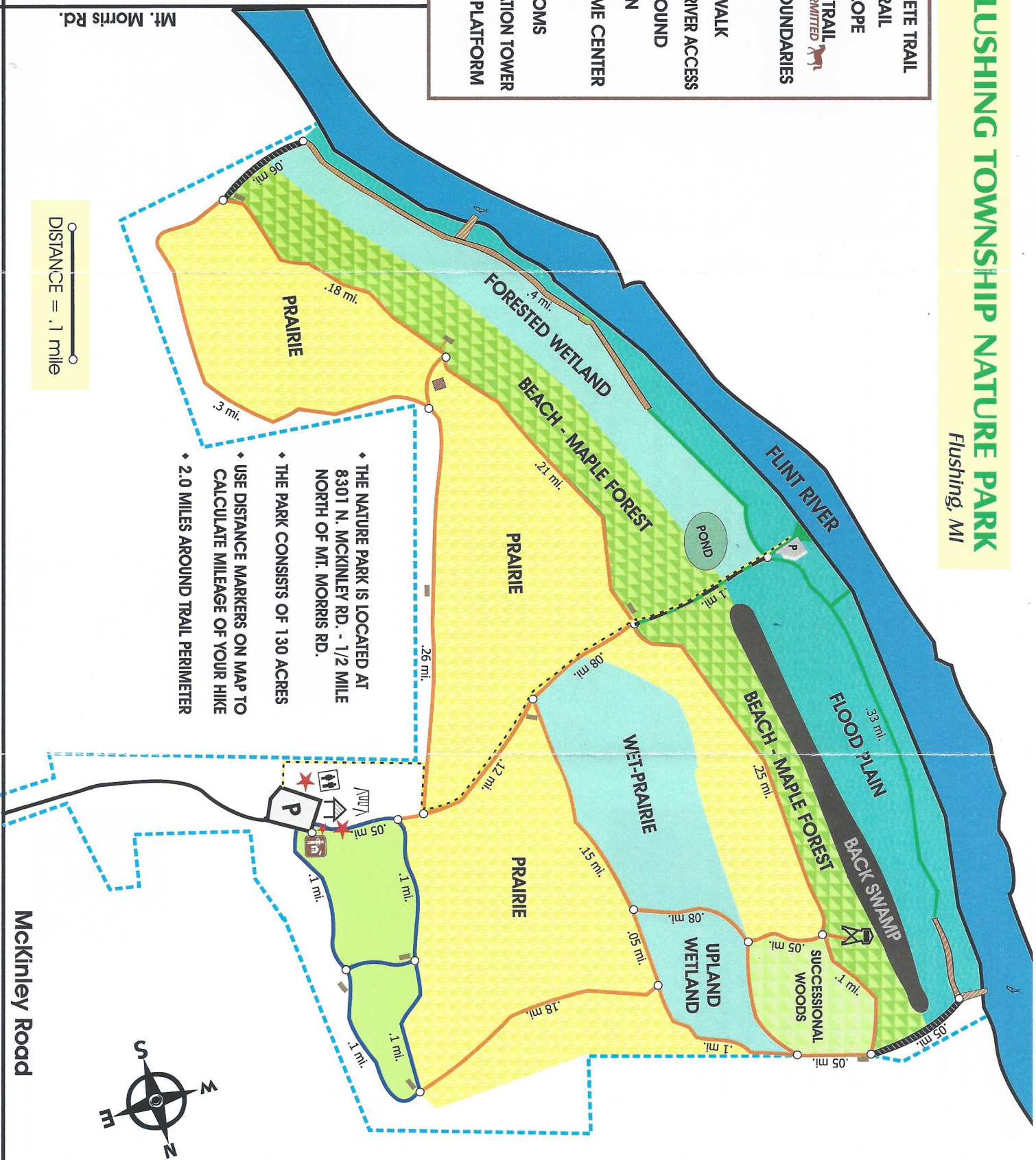
