

# Patwino Worrtla Kodoi Dihi Open Space Park Needs You

Everyone deserves the outdoors, but not everyone can experience the wonders of nature. You can change that. Patwino Worrtla Kodoi Dihi Open Space Park will be a nature-park for all.

There is nothing like this place in Solano County. Its ridges offer stunning views of a changing world—and of what endures: the peaks of Mt. Diablo, the glittering delta, the wildflowers that return each spring.

A decade ago, this extraordinary land was saved from a development that would have offered vast views and nature trails, solely for a chosen few.

Instead, people like you looked at the oak-lined hills, spring flowers, soaring birds, and wildlife habitat and realized it was too beautiful to lose, and too special not to share with everyone.

Now, this 1,500-acre park is on the cusp of addressing a no less urgent need: to open it to the public in a manner that's safe, inspiring, and welcoming.

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation honored this vision, as well as their thousands of years of commitment to the land, by providing a Patwin name that means *Southern Rock Home of the Patwin People*.


Yet today, only a few can access this special place.






### Charting new paths together with 12 miles of new trails

At the heart of the park stands the All People's Trail, designed so people in wheelchairs, walkers, and strollers can fully enjoy the outdoors.

Once completed, family, friends, school groups, and people of all abilities will be able to enjoy this special place in a way that's meaningful to them.

The Park will also support those who wish to experience more rugged long-distance hikes. As an essential link in the 550-mile Bay Area Ridge Trail, the park will one day connect hikers to trails in Napa County and beyond.



Visitors will enjoy 12 miles of trails for various abilities, fitness levels, and interests.

#### **Welcome Plaza**

Creating a welcoming nature-park means providing safe, comfortable, and thoughtfully designed places. Thanks to wide-spread and growing community support, the new improvements will include a "Welcome Plaza" with:

- Parking spaces designed for ADA needs, school buses, horse trailers, and standard parking
- Interpretive and directional signage
- ADA-accessible restrooms and water fountain
- Picnic Area designed for people with varied abilities including both standard and ADA picnic tables and a shade structure
- Sensory native garden with interpretive and educational signs designed for young children and families



## All People's Trail\*

The new trail will be designed so that everyone can experience the beauty of this place. Features include:


- .61 Mile Accessible Trail\* that includes a scenic overlook of Suisun Valley
- ADA-accessible resting areas and shade structure
- Standard and ADA picnic tables
- Interpretive signage


