

The Y at Beaver River Trestle

When the railway arrived at the Beaver River in 1928 there was no trestle so a Y was constructed to allow the train to back up and turn around so it could go back to Edmonton the next day. Freight was unloaded, passengers disembarked and the mail was unloaded.

This was the location of the Y and this Y was the reason for the naming of today's "Y Road".
