






- Swim in front of a manned lifeguard tower.






RIDING TIPS


- ALWAYS ride with an adult.

0	HOTTEST PLACES in California State Parks - Anza-Borrego Desert State Park - Summer temperatures in the range of 120 - Salton Sea State Recreation Area - Summer temperatures in the range of 120
0	DRIEST california State Park - Anza-Borrego Desert State Park, Some areas average only 2" of rain per year.
0	WETTEST California State Park - Del Norte Coast RedWoods State Park - 9277* average rainfall - Sinkyone Wilderness State Park - Unofficial 100° rainfall a year
