

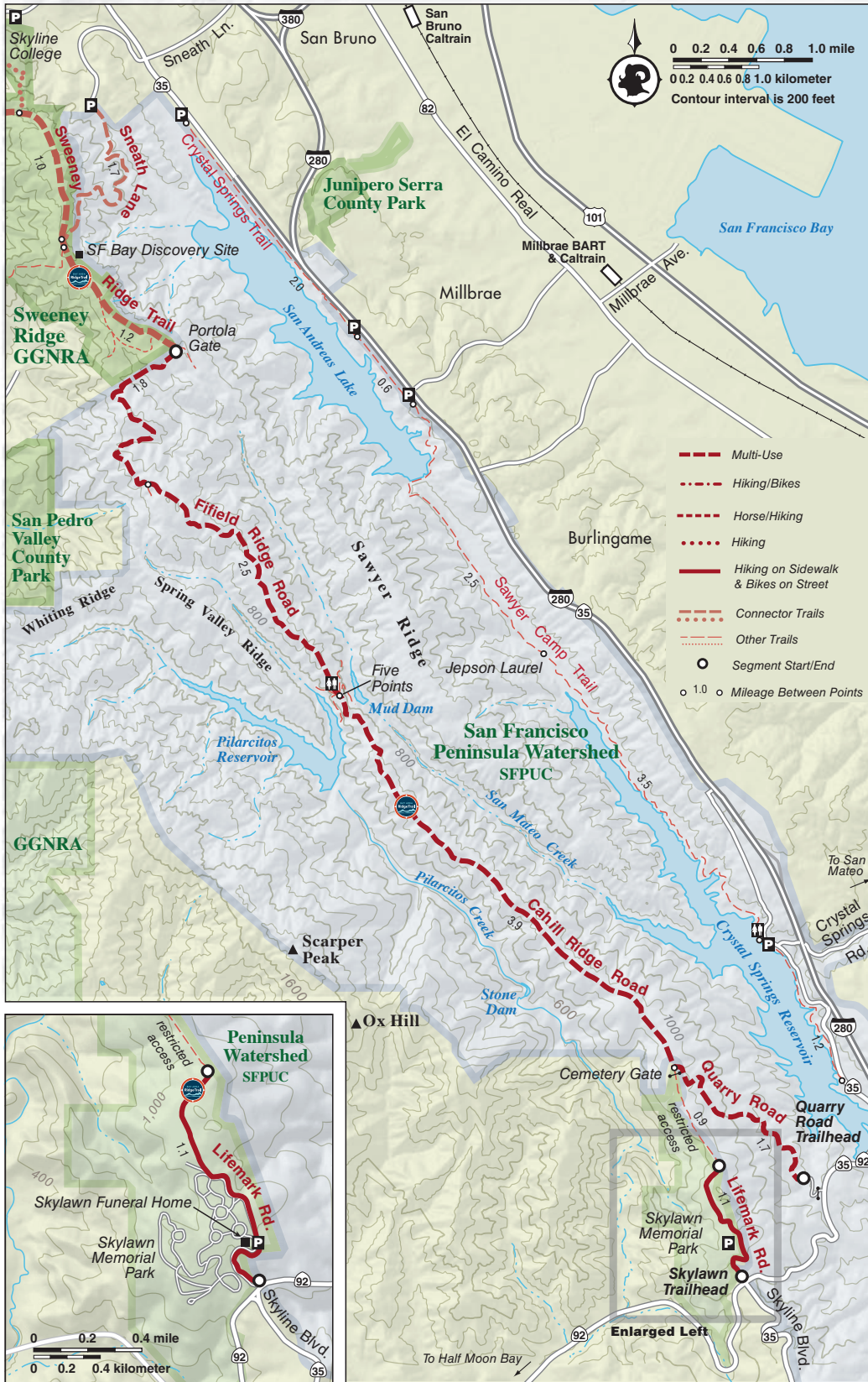

San Francisco Peninsula Watershed: Fifield-Cahill Trail

From: Quarry Road in San Mateo

To: Sneath Lane in San Bruno

Length: 12.8 miles one-way (includes 2.9 miles to Sneath Lane trailhead); car shuttle possible.

Elevation Gain/Loss: 1,725 feet/1,490 feet

Accessibility: Hikers, equestrians, and mountain bikers on guided trips only (shuttle return is arranged)

In this remote open space, dedicated volunteers will lead you through dense forests and over hilly grasslands with extensive views of the entire Bay Area. This trip is a unique opportunity to experience the 23,000-acre watershed, a state Fish and Game Refuge and home to the highest concentration of rare, threatened, and endangered species in the Bay Area. The pristine property contains Crystal Springs, Pilarcitos, and San Andreas Reservoirs.
