

Manana Trail

Length (one-way): 6 mi. **Elevation Change:** 1,700 ft.

Highlights:

- Open ridgeline with panoramic views
- · Opportunity to view native forest
- Long distance with steep grade

Directions:

If driving from H-1, exit at the Pearl City/Waimalu exit. Turn right on Moanalua Rd. at the end of the ramp. As Moanalua Rd. ends, turn right on Waimano Home Rd. Turn left onto Komo Mai Dr. driving through Pacific Palisades to the end of the road. A locked gate restricts vehicular traffic beyond this point. Park here, and proceed on foot through the pedestrian passageway adjacent to the gate. The road becomes the trail just past the water tank.

Makiki-Tantalus Trail Network

Length: This is a variable trail network **Elevation Change:** 200-1,200 ft.

Highlights:

- Varied length and terrain is suitable for all hiking levels
- Family and dog-on-leash friendly
- Stream viewing opportunities

Directions:

If driving Punahou, heading towards the mountains, turn left on Nehoa St. At the first traffic light, turn right on Makiki St. When you reach the Board of Water Supply park, follow the left fork, which is Makiki Heights Rd. Continue for approx. 0.5 mi. until the road makes a sharp harpin turn to the left. At the turn, continue straight ahead through a green iron gate. Park in the gravel lot and proceed to the trail network.





Waimano Trail

Length: 7.2 mi.

Elevation Change: 1,600 ft.

- Varied forest types and terrain
- Mataulahas sadastis fansat
